



**Public Art Committee Minutes  
Wednesday, May 9, 2018, 7:00 p.m.  
The Collective Community Arts Center  
201 North Public Road**

**Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order by Barbara Rudlaff at 7:10 pm.

Those in attendance were Barbara Rudlaff (Chair), Heather Bair (Vice-Chair), Pamela Sherrick (Secretary), Tara Gale (Treasurer), Bea Glassford, Josie Knapp, Heidi Mallon (LCAC Liaison), and Susan Booker (City Staff Liaison).

**Public Input**

There was no public participation.

**Approval of Minutes**

Barbara Rudlaff made a motion that was seconded by Tara Gale **to approve the minutes of the April 11 meeting.** The motion passed unanimously.

**Replacement Board Member**

Barbara Rudlaff informed the PAC that there is an opening for a full committee member as Kristie Trevey resigned. Tara Gale made a motion that Josie Knapp, a current PAC alternate, be moved to full membership status in PAC. Barbara seconded the motion that passed unanimously.

**Budget Report**

Susan Booker informed the PAC that there were no changes to the budget since the last PAC meeting.

**Discussion of Community Grants Process and Collaborations**

General Discussion of Process: Barbara Rudlaff provided the Committee with a draft Call for Artists for community Public Art projects. PAC members discussed wording and content and offered some changes to the Call for Artists. The subcommittee will work on incorporating the changes and updating the draft by the next meeting. After discussion, all agreed that a specific time of year should be set for issuing the amended Call for Artists, and 2018 would be a good year to start this program with a proposed \$5,000 budget.

Alley Art/Sister Carmen Mural Project: Susan Booker reported that the Sister Carmen Center is still seeking donations for this project to commemorate the 40<sup>th</sup> year of SCC. Work on the mural should begin in June, and the project will take approximately 2 to 3 weeks to complete.

## **Art on the Street 2018 Progress Report**

Heather Bair informed the Committee that she has been working on the “pilot” Scavenger/Treasure Hunt based on Art on the Street Sculptures. A software developer who lives in Lafayette offered to develop an interactive children’s public art experience. Heather has been working with him on this pilot project. They plan to make the app available in both English and Spanish. Users of the app would earn prizes that would be given out at The Collective. Susan Booker reported that the 2018 AOTS brochure is almost complete. Unfortunately, the maker of the sculpture signs has moved; so, she is sourcing a replacement sign maker. The See & Respond and AOTS reception at the library has a new date—October 13, 2018. The volunteers on the planning committee for the reception will be meeting soon. Tara Gale said that her daughter would like to volunteer as a junior member of the planning committee.

## **Update on Possible Collaboration with Imagine! – Placement of Cassie Sculpture**

Heather Bair and Susan Booker met with Caroline Siegfried at Imagine about placing Cassie at their site at 1400 Dixon Avenue in Lafayette. Caroline said they are thrilled with the offer. Cassie would be placed in a grassy area near the entrance. Susan said the installation would need a rock pedestal and a professional installation company. A dedication date will be set after the installation is complete.

## **LCAC Report**

Heidi Mallon reported that the Lafayette Youth Poetry Prize Reading was a very well attended event. The LCAC Arts in Education subcommittee is currently reviewing applications for grants. LCAC is planning a professional development seminar that will present information from the Boulder Community Foundation’s Trends Report.

## **ARTS!Lafayette Report**

Heather reminded PAC that ARTS!Lafayette is gearing up for the start of Art Night Out on May 11. Chicano Heat will be performing. ANO is the biggest annual fundraiser for PAC and LCAC and will run from May through September. Everyone was encouraged to volunteer to assist with this fundraising effort that provides so much benefit to the work of LCAC and PAC.

## **ACRD Director’s Report**

Susan Booker informed the group that the two otter sculptures, The Doorman and Sheila by Sue Ariniello will be dedicated at 4:00 pm on Friday, May 11, during the Great Outdoors Water Park ribbon cutting and grand opening. She also said that Boat of the Universe, which was purchased by LURA, will be re-installed in mid-July at Festival Plaza. She was pleased to report that the 2018 ANO sculpture called Catfish has been donated to the City of Lafayette by the artist at Dirico Fine Art. Susan also informed the PAC that she has been invited to give a presentation to the Boulder and Lafayette City Councils on Lafayette’s art programs. Tomorrow, she will be attending the Colorado Creative Industries Summit along with some members of PAC and LCAC. She said that the current exhibition being installed in The Collective is called the Sonder Project. The photos are of people “living on the edges,” including people who are homeless, mentally ill, undocumented, and transgender. There will be a talk about the project at The Collective on June 28. She also reminded everyone that Barbara Rudlaff’s MFA show is at the CSU Art Museum until the 19<sup>th</sup>. All the PAC members congratulated Barbara on receiving her MFA.

### **Agenda Items for June 13 Public Art Committee Meeting**

The draft grants process document from the subcommittee will be on the June agenda. Updates on placing Cassie at Imagine, the Sister Carmen mural, and the October See & Respond reception are slated as well.
