



Historic Preservation Board Building Improvement Grant

APPLICATION DEADLINE JUNE 26, 2020

The Lafayette Historic Preservation Board (HPB) is offering 2 competitive grants of up to \$2,000 for a building improvement project on older homes in Lafayette that meets the following:

Age of Building (House, Outbuilding, Barn, etc.):

- 50 years old or older

Eligible Structures:

- Commercial buildings
- Houses
- Churches
- Outbuildings and barns

Location:

- Within Lafayette city limits

Project Characteristics could include:

- Helps extend the life of the building
- Reuses historic materials to the extent possible; if not possible, uses identical or similar materials
- Removes non-historic features or materials to expose historic ones

Projects can be structural or cosmetic. Examples include, but are not limited to, foundation repair, window or door repair, weather sealing, painting, chimney repair, gutters, roof repair/replacement, reconstruction of historical architectural features, restoration using historic materials. All required building permits must be obtained.

More Information:

- The HPB will reimburse you for your eligible project costs, up to \$2000, within two weeks of your submission of project receipts (for materials and/or labor).
- Receipts must be submitted to the City of Lafayette by November 30, 2020.
- The HPB may publicize this grant and your project in the local media or on the city's website.
- The owner of the building must approve the application but the owner, tenant, or owner's representative may submit it.
- No match required
- The property doesn't have to be designated historic, it just has to be 50 years old or older
- The project shall not have been started or completed prior to any grant awarded.

Criteria which can be considered by the Board for the Grant Award includes:

- Longevity - Impact of project on lifespan of building
- Appearance - Use of historic materials where applicable
- Use of a Lafayette-based business or DIY
- Urgency of need will be assessed
- Research done on the property (Sources could include Carnegie Library, Miner's Museum contacts, Lafayette Historical Society, Lafayette's HPB website, Treeless Plains book, other local history books, old newspaper articles, etc.
- Other relevant issues related to the project and site may be considered.

Application Review Process:

The HPB staff liaison will screen applications to verify project eligibility. If any additional information is required, the liaison will contact the applicant directly. At the next monthly meeting following the application deadline (July 6, 2020), the HPB will evaluate applications and determine which projects will be funded. Applicants may make statements at this meeting.
